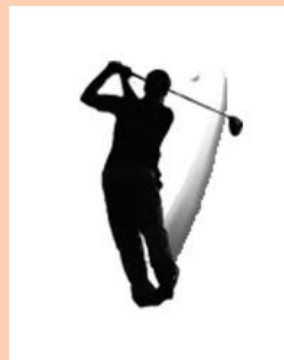
Putting our priorities in order.

Entering Enterprise.

Loveuntil Foundation is now partnering with Citizen Security Programme (CSP) reaching out to the central community of Enterprise. After school programmes and Life Skills training are currently being facilitated on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons at the Lendor Hindu School. Persons interested in accessing services or in volunteering to assisting in the delivery of services are welcome to visit or to contact us either electronically or in person.

We are also continuing work in the community of Never Dirty, Morvant. Students in this com-

munity access our homework center on Monday and Wednesday afternoons and music classes on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons. We also facilitate training and mentoring for the young men of the community via our Menstart programme.



Learning curves—How children learn.

Children learn in part by observing others and things around them, by listening and discussing, by jumping in and doing things with their hands or bodies.

Auditory/Hearing/talking learners

Learn best by listening, talking out loud, singing, and discussions. They like to have things explained in words, they often hum or talk. They enjoy listening to themselves and others

while doing things.

Visual/sight learners

Learn best by seeing things written. Pictures or props reinforce their learning, they often close their eyes to visualize and remember things.

Tactile/touching learners

Like to use their hands and fingers to learn by touching or feeling objects when learning a new idea.
